Studies + Traineeship = 12 months/study cycle

Min 2 months



Traineeship types

- Students (voluntary, mandatory);
- Recent graduate (within 12 months after graduation);

Selections

- December
- March
- June
- September

Traineeship Types



- Physical Mobility all traineeship period will be spent in the traineeship country;
- ☑ Blended Mobility at least 2 months physically will be spent in the traineeship country, but part of the traineeship will be completed remotely.
- Remote/ Virtual Mobility all traineeship period will be spent working online in a non-traineeship country.

Funding



- Physical Mobility a scholarship is granted for all traineeship period;
- ☑ Blended Mobility a scholarship is granted only for the period, physically spent in the traineeship country;
- Remote/ Virtual Mobility no scholarship.

How to Choose a Traineeship Place?



- Traineeship sector/ industry
- Traineeship level (intermediate/ advanced)
- Traineeship organisation profile (size, values, environment)
- Experience to gain/ skills to learn (your responsibilities)
- Country/ city (living standards, accommodation, travelling, etc.)
- Opportunity to network
- Reputation of traineeship organisation (online ratings of the traineeship organisation, etc.)
- Additional benefits (accommodation, meal vouchers, travel tickets, pay, further employment, etc.)

Advantages of a Remote Traineeship:



- Gain work experience.
- Unlimited global access (ability to work wherever you and an internet connection exists. ...).
- Flexible work schedule (improved work/life balance).
- Combination of employment/studies and traineeship.
- Combination of family life and traineeship.
- Gain new technology skills.
- Learn new ways to network.
- New resume skills (gained remote work skills).
- Global network.
- Save money and time.
- Environmentally friendly
- Support a Start-Up.
- Avoid office politics (gossip and rivalries).

Disadvantages of a Remote Traineeship:



- Not all industries are offering remote training.
- Access (bad/lack of internet connection, work space, etc.).
- Deadlines.
- Time zones.
- Lack of sense of community.
- Lack of self motivation.
- Self time-management (work/life balance).
- Finances (paid traineeship).
- Communication problems (slower/ miscommunication, disorganization).
- Not having enough work to complete.
- · ...?

How to be successful in a Remote Traineeship?



- Be proactive.
- Agree on regular meetings and times with your manager.
- Specify means of communication.
- Agree on the deadlines.
- Increase sense of community (participate in/after the company meetings).
- Prepare to work (internet connection, work space, etc.).
- Check time zones (reminders).
- Support self motivation.
- Self time-management (work/life balance).
- Avoid communication problems (ask questions).

Cultural Features at Work Abroad




- Communication (how and when information is provided in an accurate and promptly manner; on direct or indirect ways).
- Team-building (some cultures are individualistic, others foster teamwork).
- **Time awareness** (the balance between work and family life, social behaviour, fixed or flexible deadlines).
- Beliefs (religious events and holidays affect people's schedules and calendars).
- Worldview (active or passive attitude).
- Formality (dress code, greetings, body language, respect).
- Hierarchy (horizontal or vertical; leadership style).

How to Deal with a Toxic Supervisor



- Do not let the toxic behaviour last.
- Talk and explain.
- Follow your tasks.
- Be polite, honest, and clear
- Don't gossip.
- Keep detailed records.
- Inform you university supervisor about the problems.

- Develop some coping mechanisms (keep a safe emotional distance).
- Remember, it's not forever.


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How to Be a Successful Trainee Abroad?



- Learn about the culture of the country
- Be open-minded, flexible, take initiatives
- Go beyond stereotypes (don't be arrogant about any culture)
- Consider that culture is relative (use your observation and listening skills)
- Ask questions
- Be patient (everybody makes mistakes)
- Make a budget
- Manage time wisely
- Expand your network
- Ask for feedback from your supervisor and co-workers
