

Overview

- Chung-Ang University administers a wide range of student exchange programs with its partner schools around the world on a semestral or academic-year basis
- For exchange students from most colleges and universities, the credits earned at Chung-Ang University can be transferred back to the student's home university





Regular Exchange Program

- Students who want to study for a semester or a year can participate in the following regular academic programs:
 - Undergraduate courses offered in Korean in all subjects
 - About 1,000 courses offered in English
 - Graduate School of International Studies courses offered in English
 - Special courses on Korean studies in English for exchange students



Service for Exchange / Visiting Students

- Program: SOS CAU (Study One Semester at Chung-Ang University)
- Condition: Exchange/Visiting Student
- Study Level : Undergraduate
- Study Period : Spring Semester March to mid June
 - Fall Semester September to mid December
- Application Deadline: Spring Semester November

Fall Semester - May

Service for Exchange / Visiting Students

- The Office of International Affairs assists international students with housing, orientation, general academic affairs, university facilities, health insurance, and personal concerns
- A peer student advisor (Global Ambassador), who is a Chung-Ang University student, is assigned to each international exchange student to provide the latter with assistance in adapting to campus life
- The Office of International Affairs also regularly offers to better understand Korean culture and society





Expenses

- Tuition is waived for international exchange students, but students are responsible for their housing and meal costs unless the exchange agreement has a waiver provision
- Dormitory / apartment housing is available for all exchange students

Scholarship

- 1. CAU GSI (Global Student Internship)
 - Opportunity for exchanges students to work on-campus activities
 - OIA will contact candidates via email and candidates will need to do an interview

2. CAU OIA-Fellowship

- Internship position as the 'International Exchange Student Advisor Assistant' at OIA
- Awarded to the most qualified recipient deemed by the international office staff
- Ambassador of the international students provide guidance to exchange students



Housing

- On-campus
 - Exchange students are housed at the dormitories/apartments of the Seoul or Anseong campus, based on the conditions laid out in the exchange agreement

- 1. SMALL BOX ROOM (GOSHIWON 고시원)

In its own entirety a Korean concept in the housing industry. It was originally meant for students who wanted to find temporary lodging when studying for an important test or exam


2. SHAREHOUSE (셰어 하우스)

Just like in the name, you are living in a shared space with other people, where the living and kitchen area are communal. Other facilities include: bathroom, utilities, internet connection/WIFI

3. GUESTHOUSE (게스트 하우스)

Similar to a dormitory, they are a good option for exchange students and visitors, typically staying short-term

What is CKEP?

- CKEP is CAU Korean Exploration Program
- It takes 1 to 2 days
- Exchange students and GLAM visit various Korean cultural experience sites together, including the outskirts of Seoul
- It will be held around 4 times a semester
- It can be changed depending on the COVID-19 situation

Short Program



ISP (International Summer Program)

- Session 1 June 24 ~ July 21
- Able to receive 6 credit (3 from major A and 3 from major B)
- Choose 1 course credit among Major A courses
- Major B simply consists of 5 special lectures (3hours*5times) along with multiple cultural activities

Two-track courses (Major A and B)





ISP (International Summer Program)

- Session 2 July 30 ~ August 19
- Able to receive 5 credit (3 from major A and2 from major B)
- Choose 1 course credit among Major A courses
- Major B simply consists of 5 special lectures along with multiple cultural activities




